WHEN YOU NEED OUTDOOR SIGNS OR LETTERS, WHERE DO YOU START?

STEP 1 Start With Accurate Measurements

To start your project, 3 important measurements are needed of the wall where the sign will be installed.

- HEIGHT-

What is the total height of the wall where the sign will be placed?

WIDTH

What is the total overall width of the wall?

READING DISTANCE

How far away does your sign need to be legible?





Measure the Total Height & Width of the Wall.



What is the Distance from the Wall to the Road?

Step 1 - Measure

Why are these measurements so important?

You already know sizes & measurements are important, but why exactly?

The most important reason for obtaining the dimensions of the wall is to determine the **maximum allowable size of the sign**.

For example, a wall measuring 30 feet across does not automatically entitle an occupant to a 30 foot wide sign.

Local sign ordinances strictly limit the size of outdoor signs.

Hypothetically, a new business may be restricted to an 8 foot wide sign on a building that is 50 feet wide. Once you have the measurements, the Zoning Department in your local area can provide specific information on sign restrictions & size limitations.

Please note that the maximum allowable size may be surprisingly small. You won't know until you check with the Zoning Department.

What are the other advantages of knowing the measurements?

SCRUTINIZE THE LAYOUT & DESIGN

Once you know the total height & width of the wall, an accurate layout can be created so you can see the correct proportions of the sign in relation to the building. This will help you visualize the project as a whole to see if any design changes need to be made.

ATTAIN APPROVAL & PERMISSION

That same design can then be used to acquire a sign permit and permission from your landlord.

PROPERLY SIZE LETTERS

The reading distance is a critical measurement that will help you size your — letters properly. We will cover this topic in greater detail under Step 3. —

Step 2 - Identify Restrictions

STEP 2 Identify Local Sign Restrictions

What Type of Outdoor Sign Are You Legally Allowed to Have?

The laws governing outdoor signs are stringent – sizes are restricted. Violations of local sign ordinances can result in fines up to \$500/day or 30 days in jail.

Furthermore, if a sign is installed that is larger than local sign ordinances allow, you will be forced to incur the additional expense of having it removed.



Fortunately, you have assistance readily available to you during this process because specific sign ordinances have already been established for the property & building you lease or own.

The staff at the zoning department will assist you by answering any questions you may have about the sign ordinances.

You will see the types & sizes of signs you are legally allowed to display.

The Legal Requirements of Outdoor Signage

- Local sign ordinances have become increasingly restrictive on the size & type of outdoor signs allowed.
- The Building, Zoning or Planning Department in your local area can provide a copy of the sign ordinances.
- Once the size limitations are known, the next step is to determine the EXACT TYPE of sign allowed by the sign ordinances at your location.
- The sign permit application can usually be accessed & submitted online for final approval.
- Window lettering applied to the outside of storefront glass windows may also be classified as Outdoor Signage, thereby requiring a sign permit.
- A structural engineer's stamp certifying the wind load capacity of an outdoor sign installation may be required for your project.
- Getting final approval for the sign permit goes hand-in-hand with getting written permission from the Landlord.
- Applying for a sign permit is easy, requiring 1-2 hours to gather the information that is needed.
- Typical fees charged by sign companies for this service range from \$300 \$600, plus costs. The costs are the usual out-of-pocket fees required by permitting departments for permit acquisition.

You can literally save yourself hundreds of dollars by acquiring the sign permit yourself.

Step 2 - Identify Restrictions

*** ATTENTION ***

If you are leasing a commercial space, we highly recommend obtaining the landlord's written permission approving the purchase & installation of your outdoor signs.

Permitting Offices Usually Require a Written Letter From Landlord Approving:

- The final design & colors
- Size & overall dimensions
- · Placement of wall mounted signs shown on building
- Type of sign with specifications shown in a diagram
- Mounting details showing the hardware and installation method



Step 3 - Choose Your Words

STEP 3 Choose Your Words Carefully

What is the purpose of your new sign? In other words, what do you want the new sign to do, *for you*?

The wording of your new sign will be based on the current needs of your organization.

What kind of Outdoor Sign do you need?

- Main Identification Sign
- Branding
- Directional / Wayfinding
- Advertise Products of Services
- Plaques / Historical Markers & Dedications
- Sales / Promotions
- Announcements for Shows & Events
- Educational / Informational
- Healthy & Safety Warnings
- Support for a Cause
- Inspirational / Motivational Messages
- Employee Recognition & Appreciation



Step 3 - Choose Your Words

For example, if the primary purpose of your new sign is to identify your business, you could start with the name of your organization.

You may find it advantageous to include other information on signs:

- A Tagline or Slogan
- Phone Number
- Physical Address
- Website Address
- QR Code
- · Description of Products or Services

- Hours of Operation
- Free Estimates
- Free Delivery
- Commerical and/or Residential
- Directional Arrow







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As a word of caution, don't leave anything to chance when it comes to the wording on your sign.

For example, a prospective client contacted us to get a price for his new business sign. The only thing he initially wanted on the sign was a single word – Zaffron's.



If you were to guess what kind of product or service this business offers, what would you say? You have no idea, right? Neither did we until we asked.

Why fight an uphill battle with an unclear message?

Make sure people can tell the type of business you are in from your sign design. Otherwise, you will miss numerous opportunities to attract the attention & interest of potential customers who are in the market for your products and/or services. If you currently have a business name that doesn't make it apparent what you do or offer, you can always add a descriptive word or phrase that will do the job. For example, *Zaffron's Bakery*.



From confusion to clarity, with a single word.

Step 4 - Choose Letter Size

STEP 4 Choose Letter Sizes

What size should the letters be on your new sign? Choosing the right size letters for your sign is critically important.

If the letters are too small, your message won't be effective.

On the other hand, if the letters are TOO BIG for the wall, they may not fit!

Do you want your new sign to be readable from the road?

If so, how far is the wall of the building from the road? How many feet, *exactly*?

- Let's suppose the front of your building is 150 feet from the road that's where the viewing/reading distance *begins*.
- If passing vehicles have a clear line of sight, 200 feet in either direction, then the ultimate viewing distance is approximately 350 feet.
- With a reading distance of 350 feet, a 14" tall letter is the minimum size required for legitbility.

Step 4 - Choose Letter Size

For EASY READABILITY though, the sign industry's *minimum recommendation* would be 35" tall letters.

Will your sign letters be Barely Legible or Easy to Read?

What type of signage are you legally allowed to display outdoors? Here is a list of the most common types of outdoor signs:

Wall Mounted Signs

Wall signs are referred to by other names including *building signs* and *storefront signs*. Less familiar references include signs mounted to the facia or facade (which means the *face* of the building.)

What TYPE of wall mounted sign are you legally allowed to have by your local sign ordinances? Lighted Channel Letters? Lighted Sign Cabinet with a Plastic Face? Non-Lighted 3D Letters? Dimensional Non-Lighted Sign? Wood Carved Sign? Flat Sign Panel? Projected Mounted Hanging Sign?

3D Letters & Logos

Cast Bronze or Aluminum Plaques

Roadside Signs

Signs installed by the road are often referred to by other names including *freestanding signs, main identification signs, entrance signs, post & panel signs, monument signs, pylon signs, and pole signs.*

Are you legally allowed to have a sign out by the road installed? If so, what TYPE are you required or allowed to have? And what are the overall height and size restrictions?

Entrance Signs

Low profile entrance signs may be allowed by the road, in addition to a main identification sign. These smaller directional signs often serve the public interests and are sometimes allowed. Be sure to inquire if you want the extra exposure for your organization.

Window Signs

The sign ordinances regarding Glass Window Signs and Front Door Lettering vary widely. In most municipalities signs posted on the windows are considered **Outdoor Signs** and require permits. In other areas, if the advertisement is on the **INSIDE** of the glass, then the sign does **NOT** fall under the laws governing outdoor signs. Another odd variable is **ANY** signage visible to the public outside is considered to be an Outdoor Sign.

Front Door

The same sign ordinances that apply to *glass window signs* usually applies to *front door* signs, but not always. Be sure to check the amount of signage you are allowed to have on your front entrance.

Vehicles Signs, Wraps & "Mobile Billboards"

As sign ordinances have become increasingly restrictive, business owners have gotten creative! Wrapping a company vehicle in an advertisement parked by the street offers a tremendous branding opportunity. Local businesses have even purchased **LARGE BOX TRUCKS** to turn into roadside billboards. Some municipalities still allow this type of "outdoor signage." However, a growing number of areas around the country are making this type of advertising illegal. Be sure to check your local sign ordinances to see if you are legally allowed to permanently park a vehicle with an advertising display in your parking lot.

Placement

Where are you legally allowed to have new signs installed? The location where your signs will be mounted will influence the overall size you are allowed.

Dimensions

On a wall the maximum length of the sign is usually restricted to no more than 75% of the space available. For example, if your storefront is 40' wide left-to-right, then your sign is typically limited to 30'.

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Distance

How far away do you want your letters to be legible? Knowing the viewing distance is critical to determining the proper letter size. Most people don't have a 100' tape measure laying around to get an accurate measurement. But there's a good way to estimate distance, with a vehicle - an SUV to be exact. The average SUV is 16' long. Since we are all familiar with vehicles and parking spaces, it's pretty easy to guess the number of car lengths from one point to the next. For example, I can tell it's about 5 car lengths from the front of our building to the road. We're pretty close. So that's a viewing distance of about 80 feet (5 x 16' = 80'). Using the letter visibility chart, a good size letter to start with is 8" for easy readability. The absolute minimum size through is 3" - 4".



Longevity

Outdoor durability, weatherability and fade resistance is a strong consideration when choosing the type materials to be used for your new sign. How many years do you need your signs to last? **If you have a short term lease, there are different decisions to be made versus meeting long-term expectations.** The durability and weatherability of sign materials vary widely. Knowing you have options to invest less or more, will enable you to make fully informed decisions.
